

Prince John's Treasure Trail

According to legend, Prince John lost all his treasure somewhere in Cambridgeshire in 1216, the year that he died. He was travelling from Kings Lynn to Lincoln when his baggage train got lost in the marshes, never to be seen again!

After all this time, Prince John is finally about to get his hands on his treasure again, thanks to the time machine and a bit of help from Ignatius! His trusted helper has figured out where it is buried and arranged some clues to help prince John find it – there is nothing the prince likes more than a treasure hunt!

Instructions

The map shows you Coldham's Common, where the treasure is hidden. Within the common are six red discs that you need to find. Each set of clues below will lead you to a grid square (e.g. D7) and the extra word clue will give you the exact spot where a red disc is hidden. You'll have to use your eagle eyes to spot them though! Write down exactly what you find written on each disc. For the Letter Clues, write down the first letter of the answer. For the Number Clues, some answers are based on what you can see and some on the book, *Caleb and the Incredible Counting Machine*.

5 (Paired with 2)	Who was the son of Mr Smyth? <input type="text"/>	The number of brick semi-circles in the bridge plus 2 <input type="text"/>	It's not this padlock you are looking for! <input type="text"/>
6 (Paired with 3)	The author's first name <input type="text"/>	How many chapters in Part 1? (It's an even number) <input type="text"/>	I can see the gate from here. <input type="text"/>

Note: If you are getting tired, it is still possible (with a bit of cunning) to find the treasure and open it without completing clues 3 and 6.

Finding the Treasure

To find the treasure, draw a straight line between the pairs of locations where you found the discs (see pairings above). Where they cross gives the exact spot where the treasure is hidden!

Once you are in the approximate location of the treasure, some red discs will help guide you to it. Once you have found the treasure box use the numbers on the discs to open the lock. But wait, there are 6 numbers, but only 3 are needed on the lock! How can you combine the numbers so you use all of them?

Do take some treasure home with you (but leave some for other people!) **Please lock the box again and leave it exactly as you found it!**
